

98th Oscars® International Feature Film Category: Key Rules & FAQs for Namibia

The official rules for the 98th Academy Awards® International Feature Film category have been released. Below is a simplified overview for filmmakers and the public. For full details, refer to the complete rules and attached Academy documents.

Eligibility Criteria

1. **Definition**:

- Feature-length film (over 40 minutes) produced outside the U.S. and its territories.
- o Predominantly (more than 50%) non-English dialogue.
- Animated and documentary films are eligible.

Release Window:

- Must be theatrically released in Namibia (or another country outside the U.S.) for at least 7 consecutive days in a commercial theater.
- Release period: October 1, 2024 September 30, 2025.

3. Creative Control:

- Key artistic roles must be held by Namibian citizens, residents, or individuals with refugee/asylum status in Namibia.
- Creative control (<u>defined as the country responsible for the film's key artistic decisions, such as director, screenwriter, director of photographer, editor, producer, and/or music composer)</u>
- Proof of status (government-issued ID or documentation) is required.

4. Submission Limit:

 Namibia may submit ONLY ONE film, selected by an approved committee.

Important Updates

- **Refugee/Asylum Filmmakers**: Now explicitly included in creative control eligibility.
- **Theatrical Flexibility**: Films may qualify via theatrical runs outside Namibia (if compliant with rules).
- Cross-Category Eligibility:
 - Animated/documentary submissions may also compete in their respective Oscar categories.
 - Films submitted for the 98th Oscars cannot compete in future or past years' categories.

Key Deadlines

- Selection Committee Info: August 15, 2025
- Film Submission: October 1, 2025, by 5:00 p.m. PT.
